


# CREATIVE CHALLENGE: FRIENDLY EASTER TREASURE HUNT

We've written a story about five friends who take part in an Easter Treasure Hunt. Read the story and note down what each character finds as you go then add them up at the end. There's a table for you to use to keep track. Colour in the pictures to complete the story.

Five friends went to look for Easter treats in their local park. The activity had been organised by their local park warden who put a lot of time into hiding chocolate rabbits, chocolate eggs and chocolate chickens. Everyone is ready at the gates and they all set off at the same time...




Oliver is the first to find six chocolate chickens hidden in the bushes by the bowling green. Mo, who isn't usually very competitive, springs into action and quickly finds a box of five chocolate eggs! Wilf climbs in the pond up to his ankles and sees something floating near the corner. Lucy sees it too and sprints to the edge, getting there just before Wilf. She has found four chocolate rabbits bobbing in the water. She gives one to Wilf since he saw them too.




# CREATIVE CHALLENGE: FRIENDLY EASTER TREASURE HUNT

Whilst all this is going on, Mo climbs up a small tree and looks out across the park. Tucked into the branches she finds one chocolate chicken. Heidi goes up to join her but climbs a bit higher where she finds 10 chocolate eggs hidden in a paper nest. The park warden did a really good job at hiding them! Oliver hears the noises from the tree and wonders what's going on. He runs over and on his way finds four chocolate rabbits on a clump of grass.



Everyone else is distracted so Wilf takes his chance and runs across the bowling green to the miniature railway. In the carriage of one of the trains he finds one chocolate chicken. He can't believe his luck because the chicken is sitting on a nest with eleven chocolate eggs inside! Heidi, who never misses a trick, has seen Wilf and jumps into the train to see if there's anything else to find. She finds three chocolate rabbits under a seat.



Meanwhile Lucy races over to Oliver and together they run round to the tennis courts. Oliver finds three chocolate eggs by the gate. Whilst he's picking them up, Lucy rushes past to have a look around the court. She's quick and finds seven chocolate chickens and three chocolate eggs by the side of the net. Knowing that most of the treats have been found by their friends, Mo walks from the tree to the park warden's lodge where they find an Easter basket with seven chocolate rabbits inside. The park warden knows everything has been found and gathers everyone together to count up their treats.
